


Looking for a capstone class? Want to apply what you've learned in the past 4 years? Ever wonder why some websites and applications look better?

Information architecture is the structural design of shared information environments; the art and science of organizing and labeling websites, intranets, online communities and software to support usability and findability. IA involves a model of information which is used and applied to activities that require explicit details of complex information systems. These activities include library systems, database development, and retail systems.

CS 4634 is a survey of the higher-order properties that allow data to become information, that is, to inform people. The course introduces the field of information architecture and basic principles and methods of design. You will also explore the IA and UX communities of practice.
